In the early to mid 1960's artists such as The Beach Boys, Jan & Dean, Sonny & Cher, The Byrds, The Righteous Brothers, Nancy Sinatra, and the Fifth Dimension, topped the pop charts with songs like *Up, Up and Away*, *Little Old Lady From Pasadena*, *Cherish*, *These Boots Are Made for Walking* and *Good Vibrations*. They were the 'Wall' in Phil Spector's 'Wall of Sound.' It was known as the West Coast Sound, and the artists who sang these songs are household names, but the musicians who performed those hits were virtually unknown to the listening public and remain so today. The old studio musicians said these young players were going to "Wreck The Music Business" with their rock & roll, yet Tommy Tedesco, Hal Blaine, Earl Palmer, Carol Kaye, Joe Osborne and a select host of others remain some of the most recorded musicians in history. These talented young studio musicians were known within the industry as **The Wrecking Crew**. This is their story.
